Rosalia, I know you wanted an answer by yesterday; however I was out of the office until Thursday morning and our system was down due to a virus. We discussed Tiverton yesterday and the dredging is still up in the air; Paul will meet the contractor in the next few days and discuss the various options including dredging 1/2 of the basin and incorporating into the breakwater. We still do not have formal approval for the additional funding required for the dredging and until we get work from Ottawa then we can not proceed with the dredging. We will not get any word from Ottawa until end of next week at the earliest; therefore I do not know how to tell you to proceed.

As you both know, a new CEAA was initiated to deal with required changes that were realized in March 2004.

The Notice of Commencement has been posted on the CEAA website and with that hanging open I'd like to have this new CEAA finalized (signed by DFO-HMD) and a decision posted ASAP.

This is what I'm changing:

Issue A7 -

Previously read:

Consultation with a local tour guide operator provided information on the time when marine mammals are present (pers. com., D. Norwood). Atlantic Right Whale appear in the Tiverton area at the earliest in May and stay until late Fall/early winter (until December 30 at the latest).

Revised text will read:

Consultation with a local tour guide operator provided information on the time when marine mammals are present (pers. com., D. Norwood). Atlantic Right Whale appear in the Tiverton area at the earliest in July and stay until late Fall/early winter (until December 30 at the latest).

Issue B14, D1 and Table 1 -

Previously read:

Blasting will not be permitted from May until late December when Atlantic Right Whale and other species at risk (identified in Issue A7) are present in the Tiverton area. Blasting will only be conducted from January through to the end of April.

Revised text will read:

Blasting will not be permitted from July until late December when Atlantic Right Whale and other species at risk (identified in Issue A7) are present in the Tiverton area. Blasting will only be conducted from January through to the end of June.

If other changes are required (i.e. project description changes like dredging half the basin this year, etc), this is your chance to have them heard (in other words...speak now or forever hold your peace!)

I plan to mail Habitat a signed version on Monday May 17, so I request a response from you by tomorrow's end (Wednesday May 12) so I can have the CEAA in overnight bag to Don

Maynard for his signature, and then back to me by Monday.
