1 THE CHAIRMAN: Thank you, Nalaine. I would like to follow up on a couple 2 3 questions that Nalaine has asked. One has to do with concerns we heard 4 certainly in the First Nations communities that we 5 6 visited about the spiritual ceremonial importance, the fishery as a food source for First Nations. We also heard concerns, and I think this was mentioned 8 9 yesterday, about the perception that if there was a 10 perception of contaminated fish within Prosperity 11 Lake, that they would actually not use that as a 12 source of food. 13 And I wonder, how do you incorporate those 14 factors in your decisions on whether to authorize a 15 Project such as this? 16 MR. SILVERSTEIN: Well, certainly I can provide 17 you the typical fashion in which DFO would attempt to 18 do that. And recognizing that this certainly isn't a 19 typical Project. 20 So DFO, as I mentioned, and the Crown, is 21 required to consult with First Nations, and we would 22 attempt to include First Nations in Compensation 23 Planning to ensure that whatever Compensation Plan is 24 developed would also include their objectives. 2.5 In the existing situation, detailed

1 discussions with the local First Nations around their 2 objectives have not yet occurred and therefore I 3 couldn't comment directly on how they have been 4 incorporated in this situation. 5 I will note, however, though, that 6 Compensation Planning is the responsibility of the Proponent. DFO is there to provide advice and 8 quidance and ultimately approval. And so we view that 9 as a shared responsibility with the Proponent to 10 include First Nations objectives and views on the 11 Compensation Plan. 12 THE CHAIRMAN: Well, just to pursue that 13 further, what if they are very clear that this is 14 unacceptable from their perspective, how would you 15 deal with that? 16 MR. SILVERSTEIN: I think that speaks, 17 Mr. Chairman, to the type of Review Process that we 18 have here, which is as public and as the role of the 19 Review Process that is possible, with as high a 20 decision level on the proposed Project as is possible. 21 And in part, when DFO made a recommendation to the 22 Minister of Environment that the Project be reviewed 23 by Review Panel, those considerations came into play. 24 THE CHAIRMAN: Okay, thank you.
