Hi, Jim. I just had a meeting with Jerry Conway.

He suggested that, in addition to sensors on shore to monitor shock and sound waves, there should be sensors in the water to measure the same and also the reflected sound.

Another mitigation measure he mentioned was for protection from sediment entering the marine env. ie. sediment basins. sediment could be detrimental to krill and copepods, main sources of food for the Right whale.

The Right whale has a recovery plan approved. The recovery plan for the Blue whale is being developed by Quebec Region.
